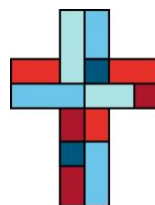

## Collect

Almighty and everlasting God,  
you have given us your servants grace,  
by the confession of a true faith,  
to acknowledge the glory of the eternal Trinity  
and in the power of the divine majesty to worship the Unity:  
keep us steadfast in this faith,  
that we may evermore be defended from all adversities;  
through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord,  
who is alive and reigns with you,  
in the unity of the Holy Spirit,  
one God, now and for ever.

## Today's Themes

Famously (in Christian theological circles, at any rate), the Bible does not contain a definition of the doctrine of the Trinity, even though that has been such a large part of Christian theology. It does, however, offer glimpses. Two of these are in Paul's letter and in the Gospel, which reference, Father, Son and Holy Spirit, though their inter-relationship is not defined. Isaiah mentions God at the beginning of creation, an 'everlasting' God. This could be God as creator, associating with God the Father.

**First Reading**                    **Isaiah 40.12-17,27-end**

Who has measured the waters in the hollow of his hand  
and marked off the heavens with a span,  
enclosed the dust of the earth in a measure,  
and weighed the mountains in scales  
and the hills in a balance? Who has directed the spirit of  
the Lord, or as his counsellor has instructed him?  
Whom did he consult for his enlightenment,  
and who taught him the path of justice?  
Who taught him knowledge, and showed him the way of  
understanding? Even the nations are like a drop from a bucket,  
and are accounted as dust on the scales; see, he takes up the  
isles like fine dust. Lebanon would not provide fuel enough,  
nor are its animals enough for a burnt-offering.  
All the nations are as nothing before him; they are accounted by  
him as less than nothing and emptiness. Why do you say,  
O Jacob, and speak, O Israel, 'My way is hidden from the Lord,  
and my right is disregarded by my God'? Have you not known?  
Have you not heard? The Lord is the everlasting God,  
the Creator of the ends of the earth. He does not faint or grow  
weary; his understanding is unsearchable. He gives power to the  
faint, and strengthens the powerless. Even youths will faint and  
be weary, and the young will fall exhausted; but those who wait  
for the Lord shall renew their strength, they shall mount up with  
wings like eagles, they shall run and not be weary, they shall  
walk and not faint.

Greet one another with a holy kiss. All the saints greet you. The grace of the Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God, and the communion of the Holy Spirit be with all of you.

Now the eleven disciples went to Galilee, to the mountain to which Jesus had directed them. When they saw him, they worshipped him; but some doubted. And Jesus came and said to them, 'All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything that I have commanded you. And remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age.'
