Mothers' Union: Wednesday 17th April we will be joining the parish Candle lit Compline service at St Andrew's church at 8pm.

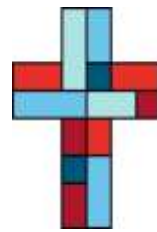

Today's themes

These readings are readings of encouragement. In Isaiah, the vision is of a new future, overcoming the trauma that has overwhelmed Israel. The Gospel reading is set close to end of Jesus' life, in his last days, and he has this moment of encouragement, and tenderness. There is a moment of prophecy that this woman will be remembered, and we do indeed still remember her.

First Reading **Isaiah 43.16-21**

This is what the Lord says.
He is the one who made a road through the sea.
Even through rough waters he made a path for his people.
He is the one who defeated the chariots and horses.
He defeated the mighty armies.
They fell together, and they will never rise again.
They were destroyed as a flame is put out.
The Lord says, "Forget what happened before.
Do not think about the past.
Look at the new thing I am going to do.
It is already happening. Don't you see it?
I will make a road in the desert.
I will make rivers in the dry land.
Even the wild animals will be thankful to me.
The wild dogs and owls will honor me.
They will honor me when I put water in the desert.
They will honor me when I make rivers in the dry land.
I will do this to give water to my people, the ones I chose.
These are the people I made.
And they will sing songs to praise me.

Gospel **John 12.1-8**

Six days before the Passover Jesus came to Bethany, the home of Lazarus, whom he had raised from the dead. There they gave a dinner for him. Martha served, and Lazarus was one of those at the table with him. Mary took a pound of costly perfume made of pure nard, anointed Jesus' feet, and wiped them with her hair. The house was filled with the fragrance of the perfume. But Judas Iscariot, one of his disciples (the one who was about to betray him), said, 'Why was this perfume not sold for three hundred denarii and the money given to the poor?' (He said this not because he cared about the poor, but because he was a thief; he kept the common purse and used to steal what was put into it.) Jesus said, 'Leave her alone. She bought it so that she might keep it for the day of my burial. You always have the poor with you, but you do not always have me.'
