Today at St Andrew's our service has a Tudor theme.

Our order of service is predominantly taken from the **first and second prayer books of Edward VI**, the boy king. The Tudor period was a key turning point in the history of the church in these islands.

Anglican worship today is still influenced by the liturgy of this time. You may recognise, particularly if you are familiar with the **Book of Common Prayer (1662)**, many of the forms of word we will use. If you are unfamiliar with "traditional" or Tudor English, we hope that you will appreciate the richness of its language and cadence.



Today's themes

Today's Old Testament lesson and Gospel reading both speak to dishonesty, arising from greed. We are invite to consider our motivation in life, in stark terms. Separately, we will hear and respond to the Ten Commandments being recited. These end with the rule which begins "thou shalt not covet". This last Commandment gets to the heart of why the other Commandments might be broken – it speaks to motivation.

Greed can lead people to commit all manner of crimes, both small and great. They say that "power corrupts", and Paul reminds us, in his letter to Timothy, to pray for all in authority, whose greed has the potential to lead to very grave crimes.

Old Testament Lesson Amos 8.4 – 7 (King James Version)

Hear this, O ye that swallow up the needy, even to make the poor of the land to fail, Saying, When will the new moon be gone, that we may sell corn? and the sabbath, that we may set forth wheat, making the ephah small, and the shekel great, and falsifying the balances by deceit? That we may buy the poor for silver, and the needy for a pair of shoes; yea, and sell the refuse of the wheat? The Lord hath sworn by the excellency of Jacob, Surely I will never forget any of their works.

Epistle 1 Timothy 2.1-7 (King James Version)

I exhort therefore, that, first of all, supplications, prayers, intercessions, and giving of thanks, be made for all men; For kings, and for all that are in authority; that we may lead a quiet and peaceable life in all godliness and honesty. For this is good and acceptable in the sight of God our Saviour; Who will have all men to be saved, and to come unto the knowledge of the truth. For there is one God, and one mediator between God and men, the man Christ Jesus; Who gave himself a ransom for all, to be testified in due time. Whereunto I am ordained a preacher, and an apostle, (I speak the truth in Christ, and lie not;) a teacher of the Gentiles in faith and verity.

Gospel Luke 16.1-13 (King James Version)

And he (Jesus) said also unto his disciples, There was a certain rich man, which had a steward; and the same was accused unto him that he had wasted his goods. And he called him, and said unto him, How is it that I hear this of thee? give an account of thy stewardship; for thou mayest be no longer steward. Then the steward said within himself, What shall I do? for my lord taketh away from me the stewardship: I cannot dig; to beg I am ashamed. I am resolved what to do, that, when I am put out of the stewardship, they may receive me into their houses. So he called every one of his lord's debtors unto him, and said unto the first, How much owest thou unto my lord?

And he said, An hundred measures of oil. And he said unto him, Take thy bill, and sit down quickly, and write fifty. Then said he to another, And how much owest thou? And he said, An hundred measures of wheat. And he said unto him, Take thy bill, and write fourscore. And the lord commended the unjust steward, because he had done wisely: for the children of this world are in their generation wiser than the children of light. And I say unto you, Make to yourselves friends of the mammon of unrighteousness; that, when ye fail, they may receive you into everlasting habitations. He that is faithful in that which is least is faithful also in much: and he that is unjust in the least is unjust also in much. If therefore ye have not been faithful in the unrighteous mammon, who will commit to your trust the true riches? And if ye have not been faithful in that which is another man's, who shall give you that which is your own? No servant can serve two masters: for either he will hate the one, and love the other; or else he will hold to the one, and despise the other. Ye cannot serve God and mammon.
