There is therefore now no condemnation for those who are
in Christ Jesus. For the law of the Spirit of life in Christ
Jesus has set you free from the law of sin and of death. For
God has done what the law, weakened by the flesh, could
not do: by sending his own Son in the likeness of sinful
flesh, and to deal with sin, he condemned sin in the
flesh, so that the just requirement of the law might be
fulfilled in us, who walk not according to the flesh but
according to the Spirit. For those who live according to the
flesh set their minds on the things of the flesh, but those
who live according to the Spirit set their minds on the
things of the Spirit. To set the mind on the flesh is death,
but to set the mind on the Spirit is life and peace. For this
reason the mind that is set on the flesh is hostile to God; it
does not submit to God's law—indeed it cannot, and those
who are in the flesh cannot please God.
But you are not in the flesh; you are in the Spirit, since the
Spirit of God dwells in you. Anyone who does not have the
Spirit of Christ does not belong to him. But if Christ is in
you, though the body is dead because of sin, the Spirit is
life because of righteousness. If the Spirit of him who
raised Jesus from the dead dwells in you, he who raised
Christ from the dead will give life to your mortal bodies
also through his Spirit that dwells in you.

Gospel John 1:35-42

The next day John again was standing with two of his
disciples, and as he watched Jesus walk by, he exclaimed,
'Look, here is the Lamb of God!' The two disciples heard
him say this, and they followed Jesus. When Jesus turned
and saw them following, he said to them, 'What are you
looking for?' They said to him, 'Rabbi' (which translated
means Teacher), 'where are you staying?' He said to
them, 'Come and see.' They came and saw where he was
staying, and they remained with him that day. It was
about four o'clock in the afternoon. One of the two who
heard John speak and followed him was Andrew, Simon
Peter's brother. He first found his brother Simon and said
to him, 'We have found the Messiah' (which is translated
Anointed). He brought Simon to Jesus, who looked at him
and said, 'You are Simon son of John. You are to be called
Cephas' (which is translated Peter).
